



District-level council with legal basis for establishment


Parents and Caregivers who advise the Osseo ISD 279 regarding the education and experiences of children with disabilities (policies, practices, etc.)




Childcare provided for children with disabilities ages birth through 22, and for students without disabilities through age 11. District ESPs will provide childcare.

COLTON NOACK INFO SHEET

Favorite School Things; Recess, Gym, Music, and all the learning

Colton's Top Goal for 1st Grade; Learn to read

Cotton is a kindhearted, curious, and an enthusiastic kiddo. He wants to take part in and do everything everyone else does. He feels things deeply and can become trustrated when he cannot figure out what others are doing, or why they feel the way they do. Once he decides something, you are hard pressed to change his mind.

Medical Need to Know:

Diagnosis:	School Application:	
Muscle Weakness	Lifting/moving things steadily can be a challenge Fine Motor struggles (eats with adaptive silverware, struggles holding writing utensils, clothing/shoes adapted for him)	
Hypertonia	Keeping upright or same position difficult Can affect speech/eating	
Hypermobility	Often (partially) dislocates shoulder and can fall from extra flexibility in anide. Wears orthotics.	
Fatigue	Does much better at the beginning of the day vs the end	
High Risk of Falls	Gan run into things or injury himself easily in a classroom with lots of things	
Decreased Sensation	Does not feel the need to go to the bathroom. Needs bathroom breaks built in every couple of hours!	
Decreased Pain Response	Does not feet the extent of injuries, and some injuries are not felt at all.	
Sensory Processing Disorder	Seeks input and enjoys pressure	
Autism Spectrum Disorder	Social Cues and nonliteral speech are difficult	
Speech Delay	Delayed/misarticulated speech made worse from missing top 4 front teeth (Knocked out from fall)	
Von Willebrand Bleeding Disorder	Bruises easity and is at risk for larger injuries from smaller falls/bumps	
Chromosome 5q12 Detetion Syndrome		
Abnormal Gait	Causes tripping and inconsistent steps	

Main Classroom Needs:

- Scheduled bathroom breaks
- Ability to move around and adjust position whenever needed
- Orthotics checked and cleaned out after outside time.
- More difficult tasks earlier in the day
- Limited questions
- Encouragement to use pain chart (he will have access to Tylenot in the nurse's office, and takes prescription pain meds 2x daily at home)
- Clear paths throughout the classroom.
- Adaptations for fine motor fatigue if needed
